

C.I.B./Fogarty Golf For Baby Sarah

The 5th Annual Elizabeth Fogarty Memorial Classic, hosted by the Chicago Irish Brotherhood on Saturday, August 13th was a smashing success raising \$7,000.

The proceeds have once again been donated to a local family in need of financial assistance due to medical reasons; the

Goughenour family of Wheaton, Illinois.

Sarah Goughenour was born April 24, 2004 with an array of physical challenges to overcome, which include under-developed arteries (most notable the pulmonary artery), muscles and glands.

Her parents, **Ben** and **Christy Goughenour**, have spent the first

16 months of **Sarah's** life shuttling her between hospitals, doctor's offices and rehab clinics in an effort to help their daughter live a normal and healthy life given her circumstances.

Needless to say this situation has been physically and mentally draining and has put the family into debt as they continue to incur extensive medical bills in overcoming the physical challenges facing **Sarah**.

Through everyone's combined effort the **C.I.B.** has once again been able to make a positive impact in the lives of people who truly deserve it.

This wonderful charity golf event began in August 2001 to honor the memory of **Elizabeth** "Betty" Fogarty (her son Dan is a C.I.B. board member).

Betty passed away in March of 2001 after suffering for 13 years from a rare lung disease. Shortly after her passing friends and family decided they wanted to honor **Betty's** charitable spirit by hosting a fun event that would help other "regular local families."

Betty always considered her health condition to be slight when compared to any suffering child without a "normal" life. That in mind, the **EFMC Committee** each year searches for a family with a child that is fighting an uphill battle against health problems and whose family as a result is fighting an uphill financial battle.

Each surprised family is emotionally overwhelmed when they realize our group has cared enough to help out. These acts of charity also infuse hope into these families that are often in desperate need.

These moments make us proud to be the people we are; friends to many and members of an outstanding organization like the **C.I.B.**

IRS Has Good News For A Change; Thanks Jess

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It gives me such an honorable feeling to announce that the **Internal Revenue Service** has officially granted the **Chicago Irish Brotherhood** "Tax Exempt Status."

The **C.I.B.** has been classified a Public Charity under section **501 (c) (3)** of the Internal Revenue Code.

The **C.I.B.** is qualified to receive tax deductible bequests, devises, transfers or gifts under section 2055, 2106 or 2522 of the Code.

That sounds pretty damn

impressive, doesn't it?

But if you're not familiar with Sections 2055, 2106 or 2522 of the Code, don't worry.

It means all of your donations to the **C.I.B.** are tax deductible. You can utilize your cancelled checks and from now on, a receipt book will be at all events for those paying in cash. Please consult with your accountant on all future deductions.
